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Did anything in particular stand out to you in Sunday's sermon?

Read 1 Peter 5:1-5

This week's passage begins with an exhortation to elders. Why do you think Peter uses the metaphor of sheep and shepherds to describe what elders are called to do?

In verses 2–4, Peter gives several instructions regarding the way in which elders are to “shepherd the flock.” What stands out to you about this approach to leadership?

Our society often speaks about leadership, and leadership books often make the bestseller lists. What principles of leadership do people tend to espouse that are conspicuously absent from Peter's instructions to elders here? Why do you think that is?

What would the community of Creekside church look like if we all pursued the instructions that Peter gives to elders here? How would we interact? How would we stand out in the midst of our society?

What do you think Peter means when he calls for younger people to be subject to the elders (v. 5)? Why is this so difficult for us to do? How do you think it relates to Peter's instructions in 2:13–14 and 3:1–6?

In verse 5, Peter broadens his exhortation to include everyone, saying “clothe yourselves with humility toward one another.” What would it look like to be “clothed” in humility?

Is humility something that is easy or hard for you? How so? How do you think a person grows in his or her humility?

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
